Information concerning the nomination is withheld in accordance with section 9(2)(ba)(i) of the OIA, as explained above, and section 9(2)(g)(i) of the OIA to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinion. On page 7 of the PDF Enclosure, a paragraph concerning a different matter is also withheld in accordance with section 9(2)(g)(i) of the OIA, as explained above.

#### DOT-POINT BRIEF FOR MINISTER OF DEFENCE

MEETING IN RELATION TO THE BRAVERY HONOURS AWARDED TO NZDF PERSONNEL AS A CONSEQUENCE OF THE 1990 TRADEGY ON MT RUAPEHU

#### Purpose

 To provide the Minister of Defence with briefing notes prior to a meeting on 31 Aug with Mr Bernard Isherwood, Warrant Officer (Rtd) Bob Davies and Mr Joe Harawira in relation to the bravery honours awarded to NZDF personnel as a consequence of the 1990 tragedy on Mt Ruapehu. Specifically the group is seeking an upgrade to the level of the bravery award posthumously made to Private David Stewart.

#### Context

2. On 9 to 12 Aug 90, a group of 13 NZDF personnel (two instructors, 10 soldiers and one naval rating) were involved in a Waiouru Army Adventurous Training Centre mountaineering course on Mt Ruapehu. The weather deteriorated significantly while the group was on the mountain. They were unable to reach shelter and left exposed to the extreme weather conditions. Six of the personnel on the mountain died before assistance was able to reach them.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The New Zealand bravery awards are awarded over four levels. The level of an award is generally determined by the nature of the incident which has resulted in the act of bravery, the degree of risk to the life of the person performing the act and their personal skills or qualifications relevant to the incident, and whether the actions were taken with disregard to their own safety.

#### Retrospective Reviews of Gallantry and Bravery Awards

- The award to Private Stewart had been through successive levels of review and had been fully assessed by both Army and the Cabinet office. Decisions were made by those entrusted to make final recommendations, including the Prime Minister, as is the case with all gallantry and bravery awards. These individuals are also the ones who have a more in-depth understanding of the key elements of each level of bravery or gallantry and undertake research and assessment against that criteria for reasons of consistency, clarity and comparison. As always it will remain partly subjective.
- There have been regular calls to retrospectively review either the non-awarding or level of an award. Most of these relate to gallantry, Governments have repeatedly refused to make retrospective judgements preferring to leave it to the decision-makers at the time. Generally, a five year rule has applied to reviewing past honours decisions. The underpinning principle is that decisions should be made while all the relevant information is available, recall of the events is clear, and the actions concerned can be considered against the standards and values of the time and other contemporary examples.
- Last year the Prime Minister reinforced this position in relation to retrospective consideration of Vietnam gallantry awards

#### Campaign to Elevate the Award to Private Stewart

- There has been a campaign to have the level of the award to Private Stewart, in particular, elevated to a higher level to recognise the bravery that was noted by the Court of Inquiry into the incident. This has largely been led by Mr Bernard Isherwood, who was President of the Court of Inquiry in 1990, and Warrant Officer (Rtd) Bob Davies. Recent engagement on this has included:
- A meeting with the Chief of Defence Force (CDF) on 20 Apr 21.
- Anzac Day 2021 publicity through the media.
- A dedication ceremony for Private Stewart held at Linton Military Camp on 13 Aug and which attracted media attention.
